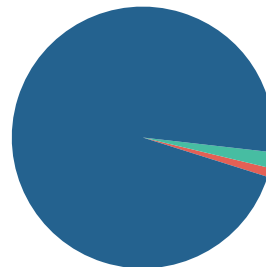

2021-22 MILESTONES

April–May 2021: Poverty Encounter launched all-new virtual tours, allowing guests to experience it from anywhere. In-person tours resumed in May.

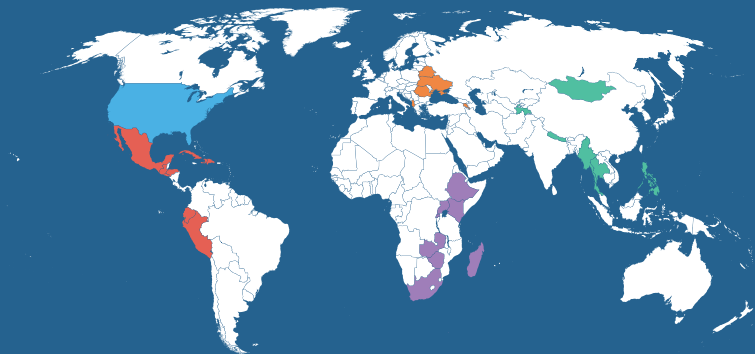
June 2021: Project Food Pak was launched with a Food Pak designed to be the perfect size for a child to hold and filled with nutritious food for meals as well as ready-to-eat snacks kids love. An online ordering platform was set up to allow people from across the continental US to order empty Food Paks online, fill them, and ship them back to a CHF Distribution Center. Between its launch on June 1 and the fiscal year end in March, 3,816 Food Paks were ordered online and shipped out to people across the US to fill and return.

August–October 2021: Madagascar, Armenia, and Mongolia became our newest Mercy Networks.

December 2021: Children’s Hunger Fund celebrated 30 years of ministry.

February–March 2022: Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, CHF donors raised just over half a million dollars to support the Ukraine Emergency Relief Fund. CHF sent funding to our partners in Ukraine as well as new partnerships in Poland and Moldova to provide food and aid to Ukrainian refugees. Funding was also sent to our Mercy Network partners in Romania, who journeyed across the Ukrainian border several times to deliver food to those in need.

March 2022: For the first time in our 30-year history, our number of Mercy Network churches actively distributing Food Paks through home delivery increased to over 1,000 churches domestically and internationally.
