

2022-23 MILESTONES

April 2022-March 2023: CHF supporters donated nearly \$800,000 to support Ukraine emergency relief following Russia's invasion. One million dollars was sent to ministry partners in Ukraine, Romania, Moldova, and Poland to provide food and aid to refugees.


May 2022: Children's Hunger Fund launched a new Mercy Network of ten churches in Lebanon.

June 2022-February 2023: Mercy Networks were launched in Northern Myanmar and in Northern Thailand.

August 2022: CHF staff traveled internationally for the first time since the pandemic. Staff visited our international partners in Armenia, Lebanon, Zambia, and Madagascar to provide training and support in gospel-centered mercy ministry.

August 2022: A special emergency relief grant was sent to our partners in Uganda to respond to the famine in the region of Karamoja. In addition to providing food for at least 2,000 families, our in-country partners shared the hope of the gospel with the families they served.

February 2023: Our partners in Lebanon responded to the earthquake in neighboring Turkey and Syria with the help of an emergency relief grant. Food and other aid was distributed to families in need through partnerships with local churches.
