OUR MISSION IS TO DELIVER HOPE TO SUFFERING CHILDREN BY EQUIPPING LOCAL CHURCHES FOR GOSPEL-CENTERED MERCY MINISTRY.

As I reflect on the past year at Children’s Hunger Fund (CHF), I can’t help but feel grateful for all that God has allowed us to accomplish.

Together, we’ve done more than provide meals. Through partnerships with local churches in 33 countries, including the US, children and families received food and the life-saving message of the gospel.

We’ve witnessed the completion of Mercy Centers in Albania, the Philippines, and Honduras, as well as a Medical Clinic in Ecuador. Additionally, we’ve launched four new international networks of churches and four networks here in the US.

We have a lot of numbers to share with you in this report, and behind each number is a story—a child nourished, a family encouraged, a heart opened to Jesus. That is the power of mercy in action. This wouldn’t be possible without the compassion, faithfulness, and generosity of friends and donors like you.



2024-25 MILESTONES

JUNE-JULY 2024

- To celebrate its fifth anniversary, Poverty Encounter offered a \$5 ticket promotion during the summer months, which yielded record-breaking ticket sales.
- CHF launched a Mercy Network comprising 10 churches in Moldova. This strategic partnership came about as a result of the war in Ukraine, as CHF sought to identify local partners to help distribute donations to refugees fleeing Ukraine.
- A Mercy Center was completed in Korçe, Albania. This multi-purpose facility features an education program, a vocational training center, a center for street kids, and a medical clinic.
- CHF Mercy Network partners in the Philippines completed a Mercy Center in Cebu. This facility features an education center, a commercial kitchen, space for Food Pak storage, and a feeding center.

AUGUST 2024

- A Medical Clinic was completed in Guayaquil, Ecuador. This clinic specializes in surgical treatments for patients with vision issues.
- An emergency relief grant was sent to provide flood relief to our partners in El Salvador to repair a damaged church building.

OCTOBER 2024

- Emergency relief was provided for those impacted by Hurricanes Helene and Milton (US).
- CHF provided emergency funding for displaced families in Lebanon.

DECEMBER 2024

- CHF launched a Mercy Network of 20 churches in Soweto, South Africa. This is our second Mercy Network in South Africa.

JANUARY 2025

- CHF provided emergency relief for those affected by the Los Angeles wildfires. Relief included ready-to-eat Food Paks for people who could not access cooking equipment, hygiene kits, bulk food, and other non-food donations.
- CHF launched a Mercy Network of 15 churches in Lima, Peru. This is our second Mercy Network in Peru.
- An emergency relief grant was sent to our partners in Colombia to provide food for those affected by the flooding caused by record rainfall in the mountainous regions.

FEBRUARY 2025

- CHF launched a Mercy Network consisting of 16 churches on the island of Java in Indonesia, the largest Muslim country in the world.
- The Poverty Encounter Pavilion was completed to offer a welcoming space for volunteers and guests of Poverty Encounter to gather and connect after visiting our headquarters in Los Angeles.
- A Mercy Center was completed in Honduras. This facility includes an educational center, a training center, a medical clinic, and a volunteer center.

A BOLD VISION FOR THE FUTURE: THE 2030 GROWTH INITIATIVE

Thanks to the faithful support of our generous friends and donors, Children's Hunger Fund is helping thousands of families and advancing our 2030 Growth Initiative. By establishing more than 5,000 global points of distribution through trained, gospel-centered churches and Mercy Centers, we are serving communities trapped in generational poverty. This global network will position CHF to effectively distribute more than 100 million meals annually, helping us provide a historic total of 2.5 billion meals and over \$3 billion in humanitarian aid by the end of the decade.

Together, we're hoping to impact more than 40 million children by 2030. Domestically, we aim to inspire 3 million children to respond to global poverty with compassion and advocacy through Poverty Encounter and other programs.

One significant step forward in the 2030 Growth Initiative will be the construction of our new 85,000-square-foot Volunteer Center in the Town of Prosper, Texas, by 2026.

This facility will allow us to:

- Provide 5 million meals to children and families in need in North Texas each year.
- Help distribute more than 100 million meals to suffering children worldwide annually.

This facility will also feature a second Poverty Encounter experience, allowing us to educate the next generation to respond to global poverty with compassion and service.

As we look to 2030 and beyond, we remain deeply grateful to the support of our friends and partners like you who have assisted us in getting this far. With God's grace, we are creating lasting change, one meal, one child, and one community at a time.

Mercy Networks are located in 33 countries, including the US. Our reach spans five continents.




